MALE BUDGIE




Young male budgie

During this phase, the cere usually displays a rosy or purplish hue.




Broody male budgie

The cere shifts to a vivid and intensified blue shade. This change brings a deeper, richer hue.




Mature male budgie
Remains predominantly blue,
with occasional color shifts that
result in shades of purple.

FEMALE BUDGIE




Young female budgie

The cere exhibits a delicate whiteish blue tone, often accompanied by visible white areas around the nasal rings.



Broody female budgie

The cere of a broody female budgie changes to a crusty brown hue, signaling her readiness for breeding.



Mature female budgie

often presenting in shades of very light color such as white, tan, or blue with prominent white elements.
